## COVID-19 Preparedness - An Ounce of Preparedness is Worth a Pound of Cure

The gradual reopening of museums in particularly hard-hit countries is a sign that there's a light at the end of an unknowingly long, dark tunnel. Upon reopening cultural institutions must understandably prioritize the health and safety of visitors with extensive precautionary measures.

It's understood that we must all prepare for a protracted battle with coronavirus. Within our cultural institutions there are changes we should consider now to prepare for what's next. The public demand for cultural activities is expected to return, but at an unknown time and with the assumption that conventional cultural experiences will continue to be fashionable, however, in many cases altered.

The reality is we can't just hit a reset button and revert to how things were before. This pandemic, like all great pandemics, threatens to reappear in subsequent waves over the next year to eighteen months, until we find a vaccine or develop group immunity. It is important that we get prepared safely and securely for the future.

When the cultural sector does reopen its doors, it will undoubtedly do so with reduced programming and a lower cost structure that anticipates decreased attendance for at least the next year due to reduced global and domestic tourism and spending.

If we all plan now for the eventual return to normalcy, the process will lead to a smooth transition for our staff and visitors.
